# **OVERVIEW**

**Civic engagement** involves "working to make a difference in the civic life of our communities and developing the combination of knowledge, skills, values and motivation to make that difference. It means promoting the quality of life in a community, through both political and non-political processes" (Excerpted from *Civic Responsibility and Higher Education*, edited by Thomas Ehrlich, published by Oryx Press, 2000, Preface, page vi.)

**Community engagement** is a subset of civic engagement whereby faculty/staff/students partner with the community to achieve the above definition. Partnership with the community involves a mutually beneficial exchange of knowledge and/or resources in a context of reciprocity for the purpose of contributing to the public good.

Annual civic engagement reporting is being conducted to:

- Contribute to the comprehensive story about ISU's community engagement.
- Elevate faculty engaged scholarship, teaching, and service as well as student engagement.
- Promote greater improvements in interdisciplinary and campus-community collaborations centered around the communities' most pressing issues.
- Support fundraising and development efforts.
- Provide a means to track progress toward strategic directions, objectives, and actions identified in *Educate Connect Elevate: Illinois State—The Strategic Plan for Illinois' First Public University 2018–2023.*

Reporting will be open and ongoing with **annual deadlines** aligning with the University's faculty performance evaluation review/annual productivity report timeline which requests faculty reports on or near **January 5**.

Faculty/Staff who are primary instructors of record of a class have access to <u>Watermark Faculty Success</u> (formerly Digital Measures) to report any curricular civic engagement with students as well as any civically engaged scholarship/research and public service.
