

REGISTER TO VOTE TODAY. MAKE IT COUNT IN NOVEMBER.

Important Dates:

- Aug. 10:** First day to request a Vote by Mail ballot
- Sept. 29:** Vote by Mail ballots begin mailing to those who requested them
- Oct. 17–
Nov. 4:** Early voting at the Bone Student Center and Watterson Towers
- Oct. 23:** Last day to register to vote online
- Nov. 3:** Last day to request a Vote by Mail ballot electronically
- Nov. 8:** Election Day and deadline for Vote by Mail ballots to be postmarked

On-Campus Polling Places

Early Voting, Oct. 17–Nov. 4

- Bone Student Center, Founder's Suite
- Watterson Towers, Rosa Parks Room

All students registered in McLean County (except Bloomington residents) are eligible to vote at one of the on-campus locations.

Election Day, Nov. 8

- Bone Student Center, Brown Ball Room
